
F.1. Death due to primary brain damage (DBD): adults and children over 1 year old

Requirements for organ and tissue donation

As soon as it becomes apparent that one of the requirements is <u>not</u> satisfied, the process is to be terminated:

- 1. consent available;
- 2. no medical contraindications;
- 3. consent of investigating authorities in case of unnatural death;
- 4. irreversible cessation of brain and brainstem function diagnosed.




F.2. Death due to primary brain damage (DBD): infants*
